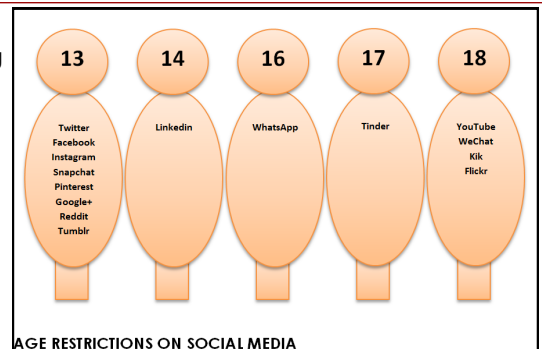
The pool will be used for PE and swimming lessons, but they are also considering how they might open it up for community / casual swim sessions.
